

- Our Attendance Policy Total absence limit
 - o 21 for full-year courses, 10 for semester-long courses
 - o 5 mins passing time between classes
 - o TX and LC-accountability tools
 - o How we communicate with you about attendance

Q: What do I do if my student needs to be absent or is tardy/late?

Q: What if my child wants to change a class?

A: Student should contact guidance counselor for a meeting to request a change. Requires Add/drop form. Currently in 2 week freeze for core classes (ends 9/16)
